

"Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful... so shall my word be... my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it"—Isaiah 55:10-11

Have you ever planned a project or event with a group of people? It can be just like today's parable. Some people start out all energized and full of ideas, but at the first setback, they lose steam and fade away (no roots). Others keep going off in the wrong direction; they just don't seem to get it (no depth). Then there are ones who get it, but make everything else more important (surrounded by thorns). If you are lucky, there are a few well rooted individuals who understand the need, share the vision and make things happen!

The Word is Powerful. But in order for it to have power in our lives, we need to listen, understand and act. In the first reading, God reminds us that we are to take the Word and live it. We are expected to hear it and do something constructive with it. If we do, it will revive our lives, just as rain revives the earth.


Jesus's parable tells us that the Word is real and we are to nurture it and make it fruitful. When pressed, he explains why not everyone 'gets it' - it requires listening in order to develop an understanding, and not everyone is prepared to do that!

But this is exactly what Stewardship Spirituality calls us to do. The Steward has been defined as one who receives God's gifts gratefully,

cultivates them responsibly, shares them with others, and returns them with increase to God. (Thus the statement, 'my Word shall not return to me void.')

We are called to consider how carefully we listen to the Word. Do we pay attention, and try to understand? Do we take it with us when we leave Mass and live it in our own lives? Do we share it, through our gifts and talents, with others for the glory of His Kingdom? We are the good soil, but unless we embrace our stewardship, we will be no more fruitful than the path or the rocks.

CONGRATULATIONS TO BISHOP-DESIGNATE PEREZ

On Tuesday July 11, 2017, Pope Francis named Bishop-designate Nelson Perez to be Bishop to the Diocese of Cleveland.

Bishop-designate Perez will be installed as the 11th Bishop of the Diocese of Cleveland . The Diocese of Cleveland comprises 3,414 square miles that include eight counties in northeast Ohio. It has a total population of 2,774,113 people of which 677,219 or 24 percent are Catholic. The Mass of Installation will be on Tuesday, September 5th, 2017, at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland. Vespers will take place during the evening of September 4th.

Bishop Perez was born in Florida on June 16th, 1961. He was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in 1989. In June of 2012, Bishop-designate Perez was named Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre and received Episcopal Ordination on July 25th, 2012. Bishop-designate Perez served as the Episcopal Vicar for the Eastern Vicariate of the Diocese of Rockville Centre and Vicar for Hispanic Ministry for the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

Food Pantry Report: January 2017-June 2017

Our Lady of Mercy Food Pantry is a member agency of the two Long Island food banks, L.I. Cares and Island Harvest. These food banks receive surplus food and other items from stores and manufacturers or purchase food with grant funds. Food pantries and soup kitchens can then receive deliveries based in part on the grant funds they have been allocated. Our local ShopRite funds our grant at Island Harvest. Our grants at L.I. Cares are funded by state and federal funds. We appreciate the support from both food banks but the items we need are often not available which is why we rely on the generosity of our parishioners and community partners such as Trader Joe's and Starbuck's to keep our pantry stocked for our many neighbors in need.

Each month we are required to submit statistics to Island Harvest and L.I. Cares reporting the number of people our food pantry has served. Individuals and households are counted each time they receive food, toiletries or paper goods and since we are blessed to be able to serve many families more than once a month the numbers below include some families and individuals multiple times in the month.


