

I shy away from pulling weeds; I am afraid I might pull a seedling flower by mistake. Besides, some weeds end up with beautiful blooms, if you are patient. In my garden, I can be patient, so I wait to see what they will do if left on their own. And why call it a weed if it ends up looking so nice—I mean, who am I to judge.



#### Whoever Has Ears Ought to Hear

The parable of the sower speaks directly of stewardship. Jesus makes it clear when he explains the story: the field is the world, with each of us as an important part of it. The seeds are the Word, scattered among us. Unfortunately, weeds—or bad seeds can come along with what is planted. Stewardship calls for us to hear and accept the Word; it is a gift to us. It challenges us to hear the Word and do something positive with it. We are to nurture this gift and return it to God with increase. It is a commitment, and is not always easy, but when motivated by love, it is genuine stewardship and will be rewarded at the Harvest.

We are not called to judge or separate the weed from the grain—that is God's decision. And who knows if what starts out looking like a weed wont turn into something glorious? Pope Francis sets the good example of such stewardship. Among the crowds, he seeks out those not outwardly blessed—the frail, the disabled—and he embraces them. He sees all who are God's beautiful flowers.
