And immediately I realized, "Duh!! That's exactly it." It is about prayer, and what you pray for.




Ask Something of Me and I Will Give it to You

It is said that there are two types of prayer; prayers of petition and prayers of thanksgiving: Please and Thank you. And we have always been taught that please precedes thank you. When we focus on what we have, rather than what we want, we understand that Thank you comes first.


