Sacrament of Marriage

Couples should make an appointment with the priest at least six months to a year in advance of the marriage date. Nuptial Masses as well as ceremonies are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies only are available on Sunday.

Marriage Preparation Program at OLM

Solemnity of the Blessed Trinity

Drear Brothers and Sisters,

First, Congratulations to our new Deacon! Deacon Ralph Colon! Ralph has been preparing diligently over these last few years and was ordained to the Permanent Diaconate last Saturday by Bishop Barres at St. Agnes Cathedral with his classmates. It was wonderful to see so many of you there joining in prayer for Ralph and his beautiful wife and family! We are truly blessed by his answering the call to ministry and our parish family should be very proud and honored to have him as our Deacon! Ad Multos Annos, Deacon Ralph!

You may have noticed - or rather smelt (lol) - some gardening work being done around the parish. The parish had received several donations in this last year with the desire for the donors that the monies be used for beautifying the parish rather than for paying bills. In an ongoing effort to make our parish more beautiful several jobs have been undertaken. The smell, which is reminiscent of fertilizer, is from the ground cover that has been put down to prevent weed growth. Over the next several weeks you will see young perennial plantings being added to our flower beds. It's our hope that these flowers will take root and spread and add color and life around the church and other places like the fish pond, in front of the convent, pathways by the rectory and around the trees along S. Oyster Bay Rd. Last Fall we improved on the area around the statue of Our Lady in front of the Church. A retaining wall was added, which lifted the planting bed, and new efficient lighting was added as well as an electric outlet and sprinklers. Soon that bed will get green and flowering shrubs as well as perennial plants. Finally, (and sadly this will have to be completed by Fr. John), we have planned to add planting beds and seating in front of the Church to break up the sea of concrete in front of the building. This will bring some much needed color and life to our outdoor gathering space. Members of the Buildings and Grounds Committee have also asked that a sign, possibly electric, also be considered. I doubt there will be enough money for this when all of the jobs are completed, but it's is something I will recommend that Fr. John consider going forward. Please take a moment and notice some of the changes.

We celebrate today the greatest mystery of faith that there is; Our God is a Trinity of persons – God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. One God: three persons.

I love to read. I always have. One of my favorite genres for reading is the mystery. I love trying to figure out "who done it?" Maybe it was the butler in the library with the candlestick? Maybe it was Colonel Green in the garden with the wrench? Whatever the case - I love trying to figure it all out!

Today we celebrate one of the Church's most profound mysteries: namely, that we believe our God is a Trinity of persons. Now, like a good mystery, we have our suspects, (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), we have our caper (their relationship with each other and with us) and we have our clues, (We know a little bit about each one of them). But unlike a good mystery novel no matter how hard we try to reason this one out its not solvable...yet! Unlike a good mystery novel the clues can't be analyzed in the lab, or scrutinized under a microscope. We can't get the story by having CSI Miami, Ms. Marple, or even the amazing NYPD interrogate the suspects. Unfortunately it's far beyond the greatest crime fighting minds to grasp these answers. Don't get me wrong. The case isn't cold by any means. The evidence is fresh and constantly being found. It's just that this mystery is one of those cases where we have to rely on a higher power to give us the lead we need. Unfortunately that lead won't happen till we are face to face with the culprit himself. That will be the moment, I believe, when ALL our questions will be answered. Till then, however, we shouldn't be downcast. We can all be "on the case" searching for the clues. God like every good perpetrator leaves his wonderful mark everywhere we look. The Father's hand is always at work in creation around us (look at the sunrise, or the stars in the night sky, or the sea crashing on the shoreline!). The Son is always incriminating himself, just listen to the scriptures at Mass – healing teaching, showing us the Father's mercy and love. And the Spirit, well the Spirit is the sneaky one. Like a breath of wind or a flicker of flame. He is here one moment and gone the next, but still he leaves his mark, changing bread and wine into the body and blood of Jesus. Opening our minds and hearts to catch a glimpse of God's hand at work in the miracle of a new life being born, or in the love we feel in the embrace of our children or spouse. Yes, he's a tricky one, but funny enough he is always there when you need him. Ready to sanctify and save us when we call.

Yes, the Trinity is a mystery, but it's one with plenty of evidence... you just have to look for it and a conviction is certain – for all those who believe!



Today is Trinity Sunday, in honor of the most fundamental of Christian beliefs—the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Formation is one of the Pillars of Stewardship is formation; to learn about and more deeply participate in our faith. And while, due to our human nature, we can never fully understand the Trinity, as stewards, we can strive to grow in understanding our faith.



On the Holy Trinity: Family and Stewardship

Throughout the history of our Church, there have been disputes as to the divine nature of Christ, and the oneness of the Holy Trinity. It is such a non-human concept, that it is difficult to understand—and accept. It was in the fourth century that the council of Nicaea set forth the prayers we know as the Nicene Creed. This statement of our faith was intended to solidify our belief, if not our understanding of the Holy Trinity.

In our earthly lives, we have the family as an example of trinity. St. Paul tells the Ephesians, "... a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." In a child, the two are inextricably joined, bound to the child and to each other. Marriage is a living symbol of the mysteries of God. It is a relationship predicated on loving and giving.

Loving and giving are the results of God's character, and we are to grow more like Him as we mature spiritually. The question to ask is how *much* we can give of our time, talent and treasure, and still fulfill our other responsibilities-not how *little*. In that way, we are molding ourselves, our families to the likeness of the Trinity with a nature of loving and giving.





The Bible is full of practical life guidance that is as relevant today as it was when written. Its advice, comfort, and encouragement is timeless.

Advice - Written by a wise Old Testament scribe and teacher, Book of Sirach offers advice on just about everything we deal with today—friendship, education, finances, etiquette, marriage, family life, and more.

Comfort - In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gives comfort for the insecurities of daily life. For example,



Following the Last Supper and just before his agony in the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus prayed to the

Father for his disciples, including us. He asked that all would remain united in his love, be protected from the influence of the devil, and ultimately be with him in eternity forever.

What Jesus did not ask was that God take his followers out of the world. Being "in the world, but not of the world" is at the heart of living our Catholic faith. We can try to abandon the world altogether or blend in with it, but neither option fulfills what God

And Psalm 23, "I fear no harm for you are at

my side; your rod and staff give me courage."



Q Do we really & receive gifts from **A** the Holy Spirit?

At Baptism, we receive actual, spiritual gifts from the Holy Spirit intended to help us live virtuous lives. Traditionally



numbered seven (Isaiah 11:1-3), these gifts make us receptive to grace and the promptings of the Spirit. They grow stronger the more we

use them. They are also strengthened by the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Wisdom: This gift helps us stay focused on God's will and his plan for us.

Understanding: Lets us grasp truths of the faith with our mind and heart.

Counsel: Also called "right judgment," counsel enables us to weigh all the alternatives to make the right (moral) choice.

Fortitude: Courage, or the ability to remain firm in seeking the good against all pressures.

Knowledge: A person with knowledge sees more than one dimension of an issue to determine the right path.

Piety: This gift helps us think of ourselves as children of God and be eager to serve him.

Fear of the Lord: The wonder and awe God inspires encourages us to respect him and all his creations.




