Sacrament of Marriage

The Sacrament is celebrated on: Fridays: to be arranged. Saturdays: 10:30 AM, 12:30 and 2:30PM

Sundays: 10:30 AM, 12:30 and 2:30 M Sundays: to be arranged. Arrangements must be made by personal appointment with one of the priests. Couples should make an appointment with the priest at least six months to a year in advance of the marriage date. Nuptial Masses as well as ceremonies are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies only are available on Sunday.

Marriage Preparation Program at OLM

All engaged couples who plan to get married in the Catholic Church are required to complete **Pre Cana Program.** Our Program is offered twice a year. The Fall program meets once a week for 4 weeks: and the Spring program runs for an entire weekend. FOCCUS, a communication study, is administered twice a year and is required for all couples.

Early spring weekend program: Focus administered: Sunday March 4 at 6:45 in the Rectory Basement (after the 5:30 Mass.) classes: Friday, Saturday, Sunday March 9,10 and 11, 2018 – in Our Lady's Chapel Meeting Room.

Anointing of the Sick



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

First – Happy Father's Day! To all the men who share with us a Father's love, whether they are a Father to us by blood or by love – we thank and honor you! May Good St. Joseph, example and guide, intercede for you! Have a great day gentlemen!

Also on this Father's Day, I want to share with you a special remembrance of one of our beloved Father's: Msgr. James Boesel. You can't help but notice the memorials he was instrumental in installing of the beloved 'Father's – the priests- who served this parish with love over the years. They adorn our entry ways into the church. It was important to Msgr. Boesel to keep their

memory and gift of service alive by having these plaques made to honor them. Seeing that he took such care to preserve the memory of these beloved priests, how could we not do the same for him? If not by the time this is in print, then shortly thereafter, a similar bronze plaque will be installed in the front lobby of the church in memory of our beloved Msgr. Boesel for all to see and read: "The beloved Shepherd of the saints in the pews." May his Fatherly care continue to intercede for us before Jesus! God's peace Msgr. Jim!

I also need to take a moment to congratulate the Graduating Class of Our Lady of Mercy School – Class of 2017! They graduated Friday and I want to offer to them and their families all of our best wishes, prayers and luck in the future! I thank Mrs. Harrigan our Principal, the Sisters of Mercy, (especially Sr. Janine, Sr. Winifred and Sister Albert), as well as our amazing faculty and support staff! They work so hard to give our kids a quality education. I thank our parents as well for their sacrifices in order to choose a Catholic Education for your kids. I stand in admiration and gratitude to all of you. Finally to our graduates – Remember, you can do anything, if you put your mind and heart into it! We are depending on you, as you leave us and move on to bigger things, to take what you have learned and will learn in the future and make the world a better place! While you graduate from our school – you don't graduate from the parish – Mercy is always your home!

Today we celebrate the most precious gift we have. The Eucharist! More than gold or any earthy prize. More than any cathedral or monument that humankind has created. More than any verse or song that has ever been written or sung... we fall before the very presence of GOD in adoration as he comes to us in his Body and Blood made present to us on the altar! What an amazing gift! And yet my heart aches with sadness. How many of our sisters fail to acknowledge this magnificent gift! How many choose to not come and share in our joy! The gospel for today's celebration is not the scene at the last supper as some of you might be surprised to see. Instead, the last supper institution of the Eucharist is covered in the second reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. Here Paul relates, "What was handed on to him" by the Apostles, in other words, what the closest followers of Jesus – the Apostles- had learned directly from the Lord himself and the early Christians were celebrating as a central part of their worship. This one line may seem of little or no significance and we tend to pass over it without much thought and want to focus instead on Paul's repetition of the words of institution (consecration), but these words are very powerful. St. Paul's instruction to the Christian's at Corinth is one of the first and earliest accounts which verifies Jesus Institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper and its centrality to our faith. His repetition of these words in the letter to the Christian community at Corinth actually predate the very writing of the Gospels! In one fail swoop he testifies to the meaning and the tradition of the Eucharist in the early Church! Now you might be saying to yourself, "Father, Steve. Why are you getting so excited?" Well first, I love the Eucharist, and this text helps us to see our direct connection between what we do at the Mass and our connection to Jesus himself – even 2000 years later! To me that is exciting! Secondly, I love scripture, and this text in unison with the scenes of the last supper speaks volumes about our Catholic tradition. As we celebrate today, maybe we could all take the time to reflect on what has been handed on to us, by our parents, our grandparents and all those who have gone before us in faith for generations. That like Paul and the Apostles we partake of the mystery that Jesus shared and follow his command that he gave to his followers that Holy Thursday night in the upper room;

"... the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes."

Amen! What a wonderful and amazing gift we have that comes to us right from Jesus and faithfully handed on to us today!




Forming a Family of Stewards



Practice patience. It can be tough to listen to someone with a speech impediment or a heavy accent. Imagine, though, how grateful that person will be when you offer your attention. Perhaps it would help to imagine the face of Christ in the

face before you.

Counsel the ignorant. Someone from another country, background, or with different abilities than yours might behave in

what looks like an inconsiderate way out of ignorance or limitations. He might appreciate being informed.

Speak up. Don't stay quiet when you witness prejudice, and be positive about diversity if friends or relatives start criticizing others' faith, cultures or abilities.

Act with Iove. The God of love gave of himself so we could be reunited with

him. We share that love when we assume the best of others and look for the good in all God's children.



Why do Catholics believe in angels?

Angels are pure spirits with intelligence and free will (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 330). The belief in angels is a Catholic doctrine based on Scriptural evidence. Throughout the Bible, God sends angels to announce his will, punish,

strengthen, or console. Angels also protected and ministered to Jesus during his time on earth. We are also given guardian angels to watch over us (Matthew 18:10). Finally, the Church joins in the adoration of the angels at Mass (CCC #335).
