#### **Sacrament of Baptism**

Communal Celebrations of Baptism are on the second Sunday of each month at 1:30 PM. Beginning as of Sept 25th,2016 All arrangements for Baptism must be made at the rectory.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage**

The Sacrament is celebrated on: Fridays: to be arranged. Saturdays: 10:30 AM, 12:30 and 2:30PM

Sundays: to be arranged. Arrangements must be made by personal appointment with one of the priests. Couples should make an appointment with the priest at least six months to a year in advance of the marriage date. Nuptial Masses as well as ceremonies are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies only are available on Sunday.

#### **Marriage Preparation Program at OLM**

All engaged couples who plan to get married in the Catholic Church are required to complete **Pre Cana Program.** Our Program is offered twice a year. The Fall program meets once a week for 4 weeks: and the Spring program runs for an entire weekend. FOCCUS, a communication study, is administered twice a year and is required for all couples.

FOCCUS: Sunday September 24, 2017 at 6:45 in the Rectory Basement (after the 5:30 Mass.) Classes on: Fridays, October 6, 13 and 20 or 27, 2017 (in home of lead couples) Mass: October 29 at noon with small reception in Our Lady's Chapel Meeting Room.

Early spring weekend program: Focus administered: Sunday March 4 at 6:45 in the Rectory Basement (after the 5:30 Mass.) classes: Friday, Saturday, Sunday March 9,10 and 11, 2018 – in Our Lady's Chapel Meeting Room.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

The Sacrament for the seriously ill and elderly can be arranged by contacting one of the priests or at any time in an emergency. The Sacrament is also celebrated communally during the year.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Veni Sancte Spiritu! Come Holy Spirit, Renew our Hearts!

Happy Pentecost Sunday! Today we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church! May our celebrations be filled with the Spirit's power and life!

I want to offer a belated Happy Memorial Day to each of you. I was remiss in marking this day with you last week and I want to take this opportunity to thank all of the Men and Women from our parish who have served our country. We your friends, neighbors and family members salute you for your bravery and self-sacrifice. To those from our community serving now, let us continue to pray for their safety and happy return. For our brave dead, may they rest in peace and may their heroism in the line of duty light the way to peace in our world and the next.

I would also like to take a minute to also recognize those who bravely defend and protect us every day here in our own community: the Firefighters, Police, EMT's, and various other positions of civic responsibility. The sad happenings in Manchester England are a reminder of how much we need you and need to say thank you for putting yourselves in harm's way to protect us. Thank you for all you do to make our community safer and our lives better.

By now most of you are aware that Fr. Grace and I will be leaving OLM at the end of this month. The Bishop had seen fit to ask both of us to assume new responsibilities to other parishes. As the needs of the Diocese continue to change and evolve it is important for the Bishop to assign the priests of the Diocese accordingly. This means change – something that most of us are uncomfortable with. In some ways OLM has been a little spoiled over the years what with having Msgr. Boesel for many wonderful years and our beloved Sisters of Mercy with few changes. Now you might say, "But Fr. Steve we seem to have more changes than other parishes." On the surface that may seem true, but Our Lady of Mercy is not being treated any differently than any other parish. Unfortunately, the world continues to change and the needs of a changing diocese are making it harder to staff our parishes the way we once did. I know how difficult this is for us as priests and for you as parishioners. It seems you just get used to having us become part of your lives and we are asked to move on. The days of having the same priests for years without change are sadly over. As difficult as this separation is, it is also necessary for us as priests to be challenged to keep growing and for our Church to ensure that the wealth of having good priests can be shared with other parishes. I have always thought of it as the most bittersweet part of our mission. Sort of like living with a heart that must always be willing to be broken and healed with each new assignment. Fr. Grace and I will officially end our term with you on June 28<sup>th</sup>. At that time he will report to Ss. Cyril and Methodius in Deer Park and I to the Parish of Our Lady Queen of Martyrs in Centerport.

I hope that you will be able to join us in thanking God for our time with you on June 25th. Fr. Grace will be celebrating at the 12 Noon Mass on the 25<sup>th</sup> and I will be celebrating the 10:30 AM the same day. The Ministries will be offering Hospitality after each Mass so that we can say our good-byes then.

I know that you will offer a wonderful welcome the following weekend to your new Pastor, Fr. John McCarthy. He is a very kind man and I know he will be a wonderful pastor to you. This brings me to a natural question that should cross your mind. Are we going to get a replacement for Fr. Grace, and if yes, who is he? In answer to the first part of that question, Yes, the Bishop has assigned a priest to take Fr. Grace's place. Fr. Joseph Lobo has been assigned by Bishop Barres as Associate Pastor for Our Lady of Mercy. Fr. Joe has held several assignments over the years in the diocese and from chatting with him I know that is he is very honored and excited to come and minister here at OLM. I am sure that God will continue to bless OLM in the good men he has called to serve his Church.

I ask you to please keep Fr. Grace and I in your prayers as well as the men who will be coming to replace us. As I mentioned above, one of the most difficult parts of our ministry is to take on new assignments. Please pray for us as your priests that wherever God calls us, we will be affective ministers who truly know what it is to serve you and to "serve the Lord with gladness".

#### June 4, 2017 Send Out Your Spirit

*Today's Readings: Acts 2:1–11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29–30, 31, 34; 1 Corinthians 12:3b–7, 12–13; Sequence Veni, Sancte Spiritus; John 20:19–23.* "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth," we sing as the refrain for the Responsorial Psalm today. The Spirit sent and received at Pentecost is a spirit of renewal, unity, empowerment, and clarity. The description of being filled with the Spirit, and its lasting effects, is powerful. Those filled with the Holy Spirit can change the hearts of those they encounter. However, even in unity, there is a great array of spiritual gifts, as we hear from St. Paul in the Second Reading. The Spirit calls us to be one in Christ, but to participate in our different ministries and "activities." The beauty of the Holy Spirit is described in the Sequence from today's liturgy, in which we call forth the Spirit to fill our inmost being, and to shed all seven gifts upon us.

Where are the Spirit's gifts found in you? Are you called to serve others at prayer, or to teach? Perhaps you are given insight and understanding. On this Pentecost day, name your gift of the Spirit, and celebrate the manifestation of the Spirit and the benefit you are called to confer. We who are part of the one body are given the same Spirit, and joyfully unite in proclaiming—each in our own language and expression—that Jesus is Lord. May we take to heart the words of today's Sequence, *Veni, Sancte Spiritus*, as we sing, "Give them virtue's sure reward; / Give them your salvation, Lord; / Give them joys that never end. Amen. / Alleluia!"

to Christ and His Church—Our Church, Our Lady of Mercy. Take a Step in Faith "I revealed your name to those whom you gave me.. They belonged to you... Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave me I have given them, and they accepted them and truly understood... and they have believed." —John 17: 6-8

If you really listen to the Scriptures from the Ascension to Pentecost, you get a sense of the trepidation that the apostles and disciples felt. Jesus leaves them, they are anticipating the Holy Spirit, but not fully understanding what that means. Oh, and they have many people angry with them, so they are hiding. Christ is risen; they should by joyous! Instead there is fear about next steps.

We all experience fear and doubt. It can be momentary; the sudden worry when a loved one is late returning home. Fear can be consuming; worries about health, finances or relationships can overwhelm us, paralyze us. Jesus reminds us that

when we face life's challenges, we are not alone. The peace Jesus gives is the peace of salvation. Turn to him in prayer to calm your fears and you will find the peace you seek.

#### **Called to Adventure**

When an adult bird knows that it is time for its babies to fly, it starts to push. Now, if the chick doesn't get it, the adult bird starts to peck at the feet of the baby. And it gets to a point where it becomes more painful for the little bird to hold on than to let go. The adult bird knows that there is no danger in making the baby bird do what it was designed to do. Birds have feet and can walk, they have talons and can cling, but walking and clinging are not what they were designed to do. And the adult bird knows that it is no big deal to push the babies to do what they were designed to do—to fly. Flying is what birds do best.

God knows that giving ourselves to God's work and kingdom and to others is what we do best. That is the design of the universe. And some of us look pathetic clinging to the branches of this world—the branches of bank accounts, and of things accumulated—clinging to a nest of selfishness.

We don't think we can take a risk because we have never let go. God is calling each of us every day to do just that—to trust that our "wings" will carry us and just let go. And when we do, we will be amazed at the experience. We will soar—in God's grace.


