

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God will guard your hearts and minds... the God of peace will be with you." —Philippians 4:6-9

Prayer is a gift from God. It has been said that prayer moves the hand that moves the world. As Catholics "we are all called to be prayer warriors in one form or another. Our call to prayer goes deep within the roots of our faith and gives our journey purpose and hope. Prayer is the way in which we work with God, and develop our relationship with him and with one another. It gives us peace of heart like nothing else is able to and opens our eyes wide to truths within ourselves and of one another."



The Pillars of Stewardship: Prayer—Talking with God

Prayer - A Heart-to-Heart with God

"Do not become so involved in the work of the Lord that you forget the Lord of the work." In other words, don't get so caught up doing stuff—even good stuff, that you forget to spend time in prayer. Through prayer, we nurture our most important relationship — with our God. A healthy prayer life includes communal prayer, as well as personal and family prayer. We need to schedule time for prayer, just as we would for any important appointment.

Pray Ceaselessly

Christian stewardship consists of making everything a prayer. To embark on a deepened spirituality of stewardship, turn in earnest to prayer. If you're stuck, if

you don't trust, if the idea of a more serious commitment to stewardship spirituality calls up all sorts of fears, simply pray. If you are stuck for a prayer, try the stewardship prayer, or try a 'decade a day' of the rosary.

If that seems to formal, or too long, send up a prayer as simple and straightforward as this: "God, grant me a grateful heart, a generous spirit, and a faithful trust in Your abundant glory and grace." Pray until you sense a shift. If you continue to pray, you can be confident that you will sense a shift.







God's will be done

Ever pray really hard for something only to be disappointed in the outcome? The let down feels like God isn't listening. Yet, our way isn't God's way. He always listens to our prayers but doesn't necessarily answer the way we expect. Of course, we know no one is more qualified to lead than our heavenly Father. Doesn't it make sense to trust him?

Don't be outcome specific. Asking God to double your income may not be reasonable. Instead put your worries in his hands. Know that

your Father has your best interest in mind and will find the solution that is just right for you.

Be open to alternatives. Sometimes taking a different job or buying a less expensive home is the better choice. You may net more personal time and less overall stress.

Let Scripture speak to you. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, on your own intelligence rely not; In all your ways be mindful of him, and he will make straight your paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).



Matthew 22:34-40. Jesus has the right answers.

In their first meeting with Jesus, the Pharisees attempted to trap him into publicly contradicting Jewish law by

sending a slick lawyer to "engage" him. Then Jesus could be arrested and silenced. The lawyer they sent knew that generations of Jews had debated fruitlessly about which law was the most important. Pretending to seek Jesus' opinion, he asked him to choose which of the 613 commandments of the Jewish law was the most important.

Jesus silenced them by saying that everything starts and ends with love –

love of God and love of others. To love God is to love one another. Love is at the heart of all the other laws.

Even the Pharisees couldn't argue with that.

While it is easy to love God, loving others is more difficult. It means including those our natural inclination says to exclude or avoid, Jesus

loved prostitutes, thieves, lepers, even his political enemies. True love of neighbor is measured by how we treat the poor, the vulnerable, and our enemies. This is how God loves and he calls us to the same.



What is a "sacramental character?"

Certain Sacraments leave an indelible mark on our souls. Called the



"character" or "seal," it marks us as belonging to Christ (Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), #1272) in a special and permanent way. The

Sacramental character is first received in Baptism and is also imprinted in the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Orders. Like Baptism, these Sacraments are only received once.

Each "mark" patterns us after Christ in a different way. In Baptism, we become children of God and sharers in Jesus' mission. In Confirmation, we receive a second character, which strengthens us to proclaim Christ publically (CCC, #1304). In Holy Orders, a man is consecrated to the service of Christ and the Church,

The Father set his seal on Christ (John 6:27) and we are sealed in Christ (2 Corinthians 1:22). It is a sign that the one baptized, confirmed, and ordained bears a special and unique relationship to Christ. This indelible seal remains even in a person not in the state of grace or who has lost faith.

Feasts & * © Celebrations

Oct. 23 – St. John of Capistrano (1456). Born in Capistrano, Italy in 1386, St. John studied law at Perugia. He resigned his post as governor to join the Franciscans in 1416. Renowned for his preaching, he was asked to lead the crusade that successfully recaptured Constantinople from the Ottomans and saved Christendom.

Oct. 28 – Saints Simon and Jude (1st Century). St. Simon was a Zealot – a Jew who believed that the Messiah would free them from political

oppression. St. Jude was a fisherman. After being called by Jesus to be Apostles, they eventually traveled to Persia where they preached the Gospel until they were martyred.

Oct. 30 – St. Alphonsus Rodriguez (1617). Following the tragic losses of his children and wife, St. Alphonsus entered the Jesuit order as a lay brother and worked as a hall porter at a college on the island of Majorca. Known for holiness and wisdom, many students and civil authorities came to him for advice, including the young St. Peter Claver.


