

Couples should make an appointment at least six months to a year in advance of the Wedding date. Nuptial Masses, as well as ceremonies, are available on Friday and Saturday. Ceremonies are encouraged on Sunday.

Program.

A LETTER FROM FR. REJIMON BENEDICT, OIC

Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Christ is Risen, Alleluia!

This Easter season, our hearts are full—full of joy, gratitude, and even sorrow. We have rejoiced together in the victory of life over death through the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Yet, amid our Easter celebrations, we also mourn the earthly passing of our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis. Pope Francis was a living echo of Christ's mercy—a humble shepherd who, like Christ the Good Shepherd (John 10:11–18), laid down his life in service to God's people. He captured the world's heart through simple acts of love: washing the feet of prisoners, embracing the sick, comforting refugees, and welcoming the marginalized. Mercy was the heart beating of his message. As he often reminded us, "The name of God is Mercy."

On Divine Mercy Sunday, we heard the Gospel of Jesus appearing to His disciples in their fear and doubt (John 20:19–31). The Risen Lord stood among them, offering His peace and showing His wounds—not as marks of defeat, but as signs of merciful love. When Thomas struggled to believe, Jesus tenderly invited him to touch His wounds and believe. In this sacred encounter, we find a powerful message: Christ's mercy meets us in our fears, wounds, and uncertainties.

Pope Francis, too, constantly invited us to live this mercy daily. He called us to be close to the poor, to seek out the forgotten, and to never lose hope. His life was a witness that no one is beyond the reach of God's mercy, and that the heart of Christ—and the heart of the Church—remain forever open.

As we move forward in Easter joy, I invite you to honor the legacy of Pope Francis by living three simple truths he embodied:

- Be Merciful: Practice forgiveness and love every day, in every encounter.
- Stay Close to the Poor: Let faith be a presence of compassion, lifting up the fallen.
- **Never Lose Hope:** Trust that the Risen Christ walks with us and that hope will never disappoint.

May this Easter season renew our hearts, strengthen our faith, and inspire us to live as instruments of mercy, love, and hope. Let us continue the beautiful mission Pope Francis entrusted to us—bringing Christ's love into the world.

Wishing you and your families continued Easter blessings and peace. In the Risen Christ,


